REPORT ON VISIT TO KEVIN McGRADY

It was very much the Lord's timing for Ed Harrington and I to visit Kevin when we did. He was going through somewhat of a test just before we arrived. For him to continue to testify against former I.R.A. members is a very courageous act and everyone in his position recently has backed out in the last minute. So he needs prayer for courage to do what's right. For him to do this means lives will be saved in further bombings and other terrorist activity.

He said our visit was a breath of fresh air. Unless there is a great miracle, Kevin faces at least 15 years in prison. Practically: pray that he could have a record player, and that when he testifies in court he will receive mercy and get a reduced sentence. Also, he can receive money, clothes, soft cover books, records (not cassettes). He prefers books other than autobiographies. He also needs daily prayer. He cannot receive any food items. If you have any specific questions, I'd be happy to answer them.

+ Heidebeek Kitchen

When you need food from the kitchen or cellar, please first ask Heleen, Annelies or Bert. Everyone can use the kitchen materials only when the kitchen crew is not working there. Please clean everything you use. If you will use kitchen materials ask first and bring it back as soon as possible.

You can take milk from the refrigerator: one cup a day (adults); $\frac{1}{2}$ liter a day for children, expectant mothers and nursing mothers. Above this you can take milk or sugar for coffee and tea. Extra milk can be bought at f0.75 a liter and an egg is f0.20. Please ask first, otherwise we don't have enough for cooking.

AUTHOR OF THE WEEK...

It is strange, yet true, that there are still some people who are not yet familiar with the works of C.S. Lewis, so let me introduce him to you. C.S. Lewis was perhaps the ablest and most articulate defender of Christianity this century has yet known. Although first converted while a teacher at Oxford (see his autobiography Surprised by Joy) he soon became a popular apologist of the Christian faith. (Authors previously mentioned in Ditjes & Datjes reviews were instrumental in Lewis' conversion: G.K. Chesterton, J.R.R. Tolkien, George MacDonald and Dorothy Sayers). Some of his best books in defense of the faith include: Mere Christianity, The Problem of Pain, and Miracles. Pungent observations on the Christian life written in pleasing literary form are books like The Great Divorce and The Screwtape Letters. For science fiction fans there is his classic space trilogy: Out of the Silent Planet, Perelandra and That Hideous Strength. Last but not least are the ever popular children's stories (which adults will also love), The Chronicles of Narnia. So let me exhort you to discover (or re-discover) the stimulating world of C.S. Lewis. Although it is true that you can make it to heaven without reading his books, it won't have been as much fun. So do yourself a favor and get into some good reading by C.S. Lewis.

BOOK OF THE WEEK...

Here I Stand: A Life of Martin Luther, by Roland Bainton. This is one of the very best biographies of this great reformer and champion of Christian liberty. In his last will and testament Luther described himself as "a man well known in heaven, on earth, and in hell" - probably a very true statement. Yet the powerful theologian, who first clearly developed the doctrine of justification by faith, was a father who delighted in playing with his children. His life held moments of inspiring grandeur, and Bainton captures these moments in a style that is popular and easily readable. The debt every Christian owes to Luther is difficult to overstate. In this book, we can also look into his heart. We can see his failings - which he himself freely admitted too - but we are moved by the vision of what one man can do who learned to fear God, and never thereafter feared any man.

The ship delayed its departure from Los Angeles for a few days because a man with government contacts had arranged for the possibility of the American State Department giving the Anastasis four or five portable hospitals and other equipment for Guatemala. (The \$1,500.00 worth of items given by the North American Christians for the Guatemalan refugees included roofing material, oatmeal, cornmeal, portable dental lab and sawmill, agricultural tools, literature, and seeds.) More than 400 YWAMers are going by land to ensure that this material gets to the people concerned. Each item given to the refugees will bear a sticker with the following information: "Given in the name of Jesus...Delivered by the Anastasis". This is done in order to ensure that no government or organization gets the glory for this wonderful release.

A telex message sent by Don Stephens: "Ship arrived in Guatemala 7 AM Wednesday, Jan.12. Gale winds, force 9, but all safe and sound. Finished unloading cargo 4 AM Thursday. 170 people involved in evangelism until 6 PM Sat. 30 people accepted the Lord in open air 13 Jan. Meeting with president Fri. AM, 14 Jan. Leaving for New Zealand Sat. 6 PM. Water stop in Tahiti. Please pray for voyage."

- + Michael Griffith stopped Tom Bloomer back stage at Mission '83 one evening with this encouragement: "One of the students at the London Bible College is from Zimbabwe and is a former guerilla in Mozambique. AND YOU THINK YOU'VE GOT TOUGH DAYS!...

Has your day been frustrating? Hectic? Just can't seem to get anything done? This little story from Charles Swindoll's book Home-Where Life Makes Up Its Mind may brighten up your day. It could be worse! Like the one a hard-hat employee reported when he tried to be helpful.

When I got to the building I found that the hurricane had knocked off some bricks around the top. So I rigged up a beam with a pulley at the top of the building and hoisted up a couple barrels full of bricks. When I had fixed the damaged area, there were a lot of bricks left over. Then I went to the bottom and began releasing the line. Unfortunately, the barrel of bricks was much heavier than I was—and before I knew what was happening the barrel started coming down, jerking me up.

I decided to hang on since I was too far off the ground by then to jump, and halfway up I met the barrel of bricks coming down fast. I received a hard blow on my shoulder. I then continued to the top, banging my head against the beam and getting my fingers pinched and jammed in the pulley. When the barrel hit the ground hard, it burst its bottom, allowing the bricks to spill out.

I was now heavier than the barrel. So I started down again at high speed. Halfway down I met the barrel coming up fast and received severe injuries to my shins. When I hit the ground, I landed on the pile of spilled bricks, getting several painful cuts and deep bruises. At this point I must have lost my presence of mind, because I let go of my grip on the line. The barrel came down fast—giving me another blow on my head and putting me in the hospital.

INTERNATIONAL NOTES...

- + The team in Paris reports that they've been actively involved in street evangelism, especially in the center of the red-light district. They have seen more fruit and openness in this area, though it hasn't been without opposition. Openings with the churches are good and encouraging. They need our prayers for a permanent public place of witness in the city.
- + The next school in Kenya begins 15 March, and until then they are concentrating on building housing for a team to start working in the Shimba Hills area, real bush! No electricity or running water (has to be carried in). Please pray for a four-wheeled truck and a windmill for this ministry. It is a 2½ hour walk to the nearest paved road. Back on the base in Mombasa, evangelism teams will continue to minister.
- + Report from Thailand: In our baking project in Khao I Dang we have 140 widows, single mothers and orphans going through our program per month. Rebecca, the leader of this project, has been here for over two years and speaks the Khmer language well. In all of the different language and culture groupings, we have sought to find redemptive keys within their culture that would unlock the door for an effective introduction of the Gospel. Rebecca found a Cambodian legend that goes like this: "A man is coming where four rivers meet (Phnom Penh) and he will bring peace with him. You will know him because he has scars on his hands and feet." Not a bad start to present the Gospel, right??? So each of the classes also listens to the legend again, but then we have opportunity to explain who the MAN is.

YWAM Relief Services rendered in 1982:

- 5,000 - 160 liter water jars made and distributed (Bobby Cumisky's project)
- 2,550,000 bars of soap made and distributed
- 36,000 people clothed in Phanat Nikhom, Khao I Dang and the border
- 5,000 sandals made from used tires
- 4,000 trained and employed through YWAM in three camps
- 6,000 under age 5 given immunizations against polio, measles, tetanus, etc.
- 750 children taught daily in YWAM preschools and daycare centers
- Also in Bangkok, our hospitality staff of two people welcomed ~~more than~~ 1,400 visitors or approximately 4 people per day throughout 1982. This number included outreach teams, visitors to the refugee camps and other travelers. Whoooooh!!! That is a lot of beds a meals prepared in our two little houses. These girls have been looking a little tired recently.

BOOK OF THE WEEK...

Reaching the Arabs: A Felt Need Approach by Zim Matheny. This book is a significant contribution to the growing literature dealing with Muslim evangelism. It wrestles with the question of how missionaries can present the message of the Gospel in such a way that a Muslim can actually perceive it as being good news for him. What are the felt or perceived needs of someone in a Muslim culture? How can the Gospel be presented in such a way that it addresses these "felt needs?" What are the barriers to a Muslims response to the Gospel, and what is their relative power over the people? Like many contemporary writers on Islam, Matheny concludes that the primary barrier to a Muslim conversion is social and not theological. How may that understanding shape our strategy? Valuable reading for anyone who will be sharing with Muslims. Ed Sherman

INTERNATIONAL NOTES...

- + Anastasis news - Guatemala is a nation ready for the gospel. Luis Palau preached to over 850,000 people there in the November celebration of 100 years of missions in Guatemala. As our teams of crew and students went into Guatemala City and the villages around our port, they found open hearts. Up to 1,000 people would stand in the square in front of the presidential palace to watch dramas and listen to the preaching of the gospel. The president of Guatemala, President Rios Montt, came to know the Lord after observing the sacrifice and love of Christians who came to help the poor of his country after the 1976 earthquake. He was profoundly moved. Many times over the last months, God has spoken to President Montt to take up the cause of the poor and needy. He is concerned about those who can not help themselves. He longs to reach out to this hurting population with the loving care of Christ. He has also moved to bring Indian representatives in the government's House of Representatives for the first time. He is seeking their input in writing a new constitution for this nation. The ship then sailed on to Tahiti, where they held an open air meeting and about 40 came forward. There is a strong Catholic renewal there now. It took 2½ weeks to get to Tahiti and another week from there to New Zealand. The ship's arrival there was on national television. They had a civic dinner and church leaders seminar in Whangarei with Winkey Pratney as the guest speaker. Subjects from a telex for us to be in prayer about are: that more pastors and churches will catch the vision of Operation Resurrection, that unity in the spirit will result from taking part in O.R., that resulting unity would be seen by the nation, that the ship would be a catalyst and that people in New Zealand would give generously to the needs of the Anastasis.
- + Jonathan McRostie of Operation Mobilization was given a 10-day holiday from the hospital to attend Mission '83 where he shared an appeal for commitment to cross-cultural mission work. Also, the Lord has provided a house for his family.

So we as a team were able to pray for God's hand to move into this war-struck land, especially for his people who, in the south, number 30 percent of the population.
- We were able to encourage our missionary friends and also the youth groups in particular. During the week, much of our time was spent in practical work: we were able to build a small house from mud and mudbricks for the translators of the old testament into the tribal language, we put a roof on another church, finished digging a well out to 20 meters, etc. The girls spent time typing manuscripts, drawing health lessons and so on. weekends we went out into the bush villages to sing and teach in the little churches (usually under a mango tree). Our personal contacts were very special and we were able to encourage and challenge many. We came back, but the rest of the team (5) will stay until the end of June. 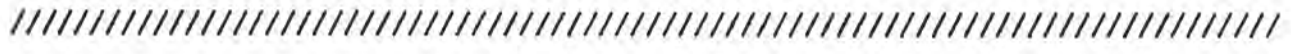

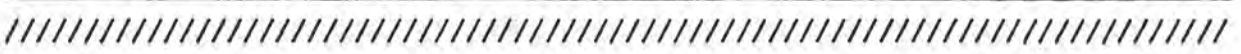
