my love,

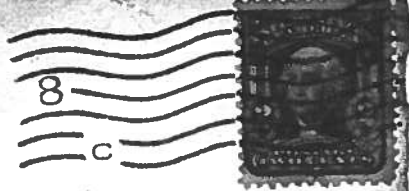
