We want to express our appreciation for the fine tapestry of prancing horses that you sent to us through our son Len. It is a beautiful piece of art, and we intend to place it in a prominent location of our home. It also provides us with another pleasant reminder of you folks and of China. Many thanks. Len had included it with his shipment from China, and it had arrived just a few days ago.

In my last letter I requested some information about Tsingtao Youth for Christ that Dr. Torrey Johnson, founder of Youth for Christ, wanted for the archives in the Billy Graham Center at Wheaton College. The thought has since come to mind that it would be important to know something of the long-term results of Tsingtao Youth for Christ. I have always felt that Youth for Christ in Tsingtao was the work of the Lord, and we were only instruments in His hands. But are any of the influences of Youth for Christ still evident in Tsingtao? Although forty years have passed, can any ties be distinguished between Youth for Christ and the present Christian activities there? How about the Christians who were active in Youth for Christ? What has happened to them? Are some of them still there?
