## Calvary Baptist Observes 60th Anniversary; 4 Services Listed; Former Ministers to Preach

A Children's day program at 10 a.m. Sunday will start off the cele-bration's last day. Music will be led by Mr. Brandom, and the Rev. Mr. Scherstrom will speak.

The Rev. Ragnar Arlander, former minister and mission secretary for the Swedish Baptist conference, will speak at the Historical hour at 4 p.m. The 7:30 gospel hour will conclude

the day's services, with an organ recital by Mr. Brandom, and music will be provided by the choir. The Rev. William Turnwall, now serving as secretary of home missions for the General Baptist conference, will preach the concluding sermon.

Calvary was established in May, 1886, when Evanston members of the First Swedish Baptist church of Chicago began an Evanston mission. Meetings were held in the North Evanston school building and in pri-vate homes, with the Rev. N. E. Nelson as the first minister. 6-6-46
