present a one-night-only reading of
"8," a play chronicling the historic
trial in the federal constitutional
challenge to California's Proposition
8, written by AFER Founding Board
Member and Academy Awardwinning writer Dustin Lance Black.

"8" is an unprecedented account of the Federal District Court trial in Perry v. Schwarzenegger (now Perry v. Brown), the case filed by AFER to overturn Proposition 8, which stripped gay and lesbian Californians of the fundamental right to marry.

Black, who penned the Academy Award-winning feature film Milk and the new critically-acclaimed film J. Edgar, based "8" on the actual words of the trial transcripts, first-hand observations of the courtroom drama and interviews with the plaintiffs and their families.

"8" had its much-heralded Broadway world premiere on September 19, 2011, at the sold-out Eugene O'Neill Theatre in New York City. The production brought in over one million dollars to support AFER's efforts to achieve full federal marriage equality. The play is set for multicity performances in 2012, including an all-star performance in Los Angeles on March 3, 2012 featuring Academy Award-winner George Clooney.

While plans for REP's sharing of "8" are still being finalized, REP is thrilled to announce that the reading will take place on SATURDAY, APRIL 21st. The reading will be directed by veteran REP Ensemble-member Jesse R. Gephart and will feature artists and personalities from across the Triangle.
