Dear Brother Tai!

Long ago I received a kind letter from you. Of the same I understand that the good Lord had protected you and the Church and that the work was prospering.

Here in Kiach sien we are all right too. Mrs. Anderson and her daughter left for Sweden some time ago on furlough. Strutz's family left also for Sweden last Monday. They left earlier than expected because Mrs. Strutz was not very well.

The work is going on both in the city and in the country about as usual. We finished the Summer-classes the 10th of this month. It was very good classes with large attendances. Last Sunday we baptized 34 persons here. As an addition 52 Chinese were baptized in Yuano-Kow-choang - eight li west of Ma-Ku-choang. There has been a good revival going on at that place during the year.

Mr. Kao Hsing-han has left Kaomi and moved back to his native home, Kiach sien. He is helping us in the work some, but is free to go to other places if called. The Middle School has not been opened during this year. The Principal, Mr. Wang, is helping the Kiach sien Church as its preacher. Oh Shuen-hsing has come back from Kaomi. Other workers are as before.

Trust you and your family are well and that God is with you all - in all your doings.
