My grandmother, Johanna Ericsson died when she was only twenty-two or twenty-three years old, leaving four boys. My father was the eldest. Her death was one of the principal reasons our family lost contact with each other.

I am sure you know that Jim Kavanagh had a heart attack a few months ago. He was doing quite well and I visited him a few times both at the hospital and at home. I am sorry to report that he has had a set-back and is in the hospital again. It is our hope and prayer that he will have a rapid recovery.
